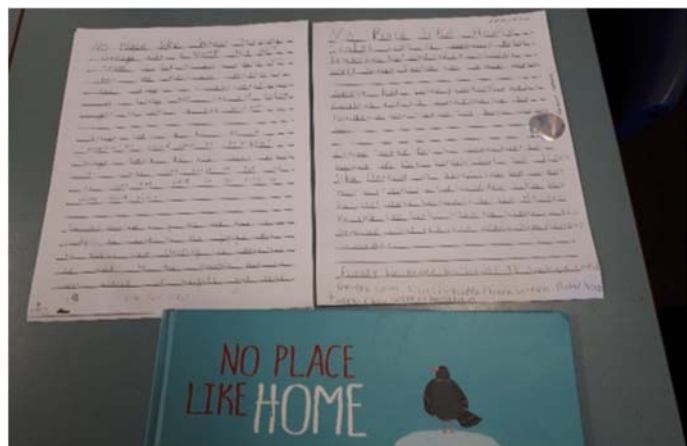

## Class in Focus 2P



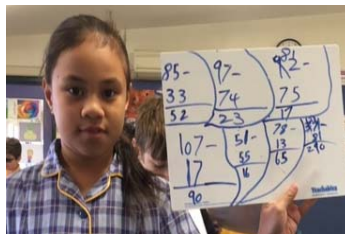
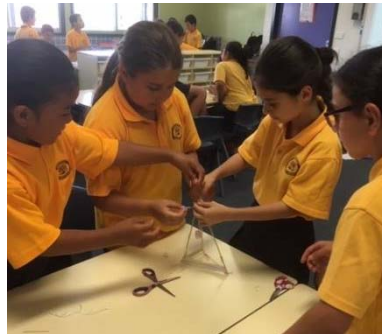
In the last few weeks we have been learning about the theme in books we have been reading. We love writing and we have planned, written and published a retell of a story that includes the author's message or main idea.

We also enjoy maths and we have been doing many different activities to learn about fractions.

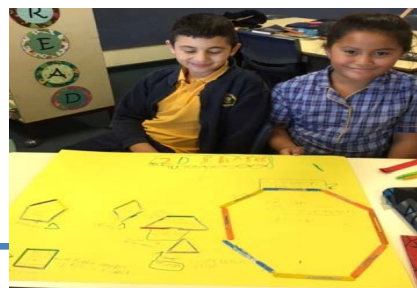
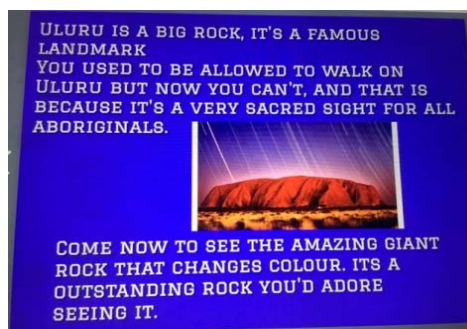
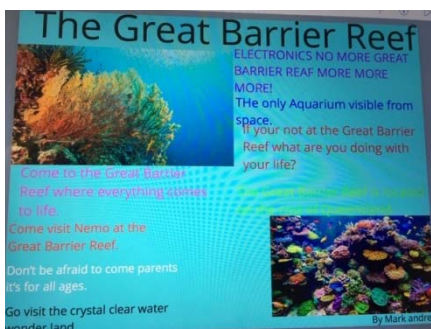
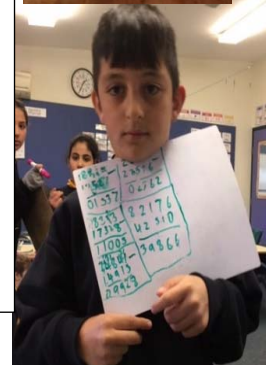
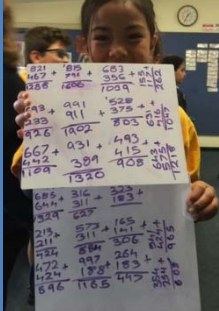




# Class in Focus 4A
